Tate Electrical Services Ltd actively strives to further environmental resource conservation and protection of the environment by exercising best management and operational practice and introducing innovative solutions. As a company we are aware that our activities have an impact on the environment and seek to minimize this. We respect the principle of Sustainable Development and aim to work in a way that meets the needs of today's generation whilst ensuring that future generations can also meet their needs.

Overall Scope

The installation, maintenance and facilities management for electrical and mechanical services and renewables.

We are committed to:

- Complying and keeping up to date with environmental legislation and our relevant compliance obligations
- Preventing pollution
- Continually working to reduce our environmental impacts – minimizing waste produced, minimizing our energy use, training staff and encouraging greener transport options

Specific areas where we are working to reduce our environmental footprint:

- Working with our staff to make all the building's operations as environmentally friendly as we can, heating and lighting our premises efficiently.
- Investigating how much waste we generate, using segregation to enable higher rates of recycling.
- Looking at how people travel to and from our site: encouraging public transport and cycling.
- Looking at what we buy – sourcing goods with low environmental impact and working with local suppliers wherever possible.

Continual Improvement

Tate Electrical Services Ltd are committed to driving continuous improvement across all areas of the business including the company's impact on the environment. Tate Electrical Services Ltd reduce their impact on the environment by continually reviewing the aspects and impacts register in line with their aspects & impacts procedure. These aspects and impacts form the basis for producing Tate Electrical Services Ltd objectives and targets.

Tate Electrical Services Ltd environmental objectives and targets are set and reviewed within Management Review meetings and then briefed to all members of staff. These objectives ensure that Tate Electrical Services Ltd are actively trying to reduce their environmental impact, carbon footprint and minimise wastes produced and energy use.

This procedure is briefed to all Tate Electrical Services Ltd staff and is issued to all our suppliers, subcontractors and customers. This policy is available to view by our interested parties on our company website.

Waste Disposal

Disposal and transport of waste from construction, maintenance and office sites must be carried out in a responsible manner, and with due regard to all environmental considerations, and in keeping with the terms and conditions of our contracts. The company endeavors to minimise spillage and maintain good housekeeping. This will be achieved by: -

- (a) Emission of products to atmosphere: -
- Incineration of waste products will conform to guidelines set out in the Clean Air Act, EEC and Government Guidelines to ensure minimum emission of environmentally unfriendly discharges.
 - Disposal and treatment of gaseous emissions will accord with the relevant standards and recommendations.
 - Where applicable emission monitoring equipment shall be installed, and equipment maintained and regularly monitored.
 - Where suitable alternatives exist, products or processes that represent a significant environmental hazard by emission will not be used.
 - Complying with Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) regulations. By adhering to WEEE directives, individuals and organizations ensure proper disposal and recycling of electronic products at the end of their lifecycle. This involves responsibly handling, collecting, treating, and recycling electrical and electronic equipment to minimize environmental impact and health hazards associated with hazardous substances present in such waste.
- (b) Discharge of waste into the ground/water system: -
- Best practicable means will be used to ensure that substances and chemical waste will be collated, and arrangements made for safe and ecological disposal.
 - Best practicable means will be used to ensure that harmful elements of chemicals and substances will be neutralized before disposal. Any discharge into public sewers will be in line with local authority regulations and relevant guidance.
 - Where suitable alternatives exist, environmentally unfriendly products will not be used.



Energy Conservation

- Energy consumption will be controlled.
- Existing energy efficiency measures within the Company's responsibility will be reviewed and maintained.
- Proposals for increased efficiency in the use of energy resources will be advised to Customers where appropriate.
- The Company will advise Customers of changes in best practice and legislation where applicable in the use and management of energy.

Recycling

Careful consideration is to be given to the elimination or minimisation of waste at source and to the recycling or reuse of materials and in accordance with current practical alternatives in recycling waste, the Company will attempt to advise its customers of the economic alternatives.

Effects on the Community

Noise, odour, atmospheric emission, traffic and other aspects of the activities of the company that can affect the local community in the areas in which we operate are to be controlled to the lowest practical level. The company seeks to be a good neighbour by maintaining all offices and associated construction sites to the highest standards.

General

Tate Electrical Services Ltd will always respect and adopt the goodwill and procedures already used by Clients when dealing with local environmentalists, council officials and similar bodies.

Railway Works

Tate Electrical Services Ltd is aware and comply with Network Rail environmental policy. All staff have also been informed of the effects that light and noise can have on the operation of the railway.
